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## Bourbonham Presents Buffalo Trace 6 Millionth Barrel Bourbon Pairing Dinner to Benefit National Multiple Sclerosis Society

**Birmingham, Ala.** — On November 5, 2019, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society will be hosting a 5-course bourbon pairing dinner fundraiser featuring some of Buffalo Trace's finest bourbon to raise funds to stop MS in its tracks, restore what has been lost and end MS forever.

The evening will be held at Galley & Garden with a beautifully crafted pairing menu to compliment a selection of the award-winning bourbons produced at Buffalo Trace such as Weller, E.H. Taylor, Blanton's, Sazerac Rye & Stagg Jr. The event will feature an exclusive prize drawing for one of the commemorative 6 Millionth Barrel bottles of Buffalo Trace Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey. Freddie Johnson, a 3rd generation Buffalo Trace employee and current tour guide will be in attendance to discuss the significance of the 6 Millionth Barrel. Like most of the other bourbon legends, whiskey runs in his blood. Freddie's grandfather, Jimmy Johnson Sr., started at Buffalo Trace in 1912. Each bottle from the Sixth Millionth Barrel has a handsomely handwritten description on the glass. The bottles in turn have been packaged in a numbered hardwood showcase box that includes a piece of the charred oak stave from the historic barrel and small brochure explaining the significance of this collector's edition. This commemorative bottling of the Buffalo Trace Sixth Million Barrel will not be available in stores. Bottles have only been gifted to a select 400 non-profits nationwide.

Along with food and drink, patrons will have the opportunity to partake in a silent auction consisting of an array of items. "This evening will be a wonderful way to kick off the lead up to our 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Bourbonham that will be held Sunday, January 19 at The Haven." says event director Kate Schroeder.

Tickets to the dinner will be released Tuesday, October 15 at 8 a.m. (cst). There will be a limited 75 tickets available for purchase. The tickets will be \$150 and will include your dinner and bourbon pairing experience as well as one entry for the 6 Millionth Barrel prize drawing. Further donations for additional prize drawing entries can be made the night of the event.
